

# Cotswold Hills and Dodington Park

East of Chipping Sodbury the steep scarp of the **Cotswold Hills** can be seen in the distance, rising dramatically from the open valleys of the Frome and the Severn. On a clear day you can see the ramparts of the Iron Age hill fort at Little Sodbury on the skyline, as well as two castellated towers. The towers are air shafts, installed to provide ventilation and access for the railway workers who built the Great Western Railway Tunnel at the turn of the twentieth century.

Leaving Chapel Lane in Old Sodbury, the Frome Valley Walkway now joins the Cotswold Way National Trail, passing through the attractive landscaped parkland of the **Dodington Park** estate, designed by Capability Brown in the seventeenth century. Here the Frome Walkway finishes, or starts, at the actual source of the River Frome.
