



Eastville Park is Bristol's gateway to the Frome Valley. It was bought by Bristol City Corporation in 1889, where it was laid out as a traditional Victorian park. Many of the features still remain today, with avenues of trees, and an attractive lake with

islands that are used by ducks, coots, swans and even the occasional Heron. The park also has facilities for sport, including football, tennis and bowls. The local community are actively involved in helping to restore the park, and hold numerous events and activities.

Further upstream, on the north bank, close to the large alder trees near the weir, are the remnants of an old stone wall - all that remains of a swimming pool built for local children.



Eastville Community Garden has been created in an old open-air swimming pool. It's a delightful garden with a wildlife area with a pond and reedbed as well as planted borders, seating and a performance area.
