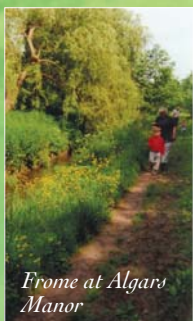
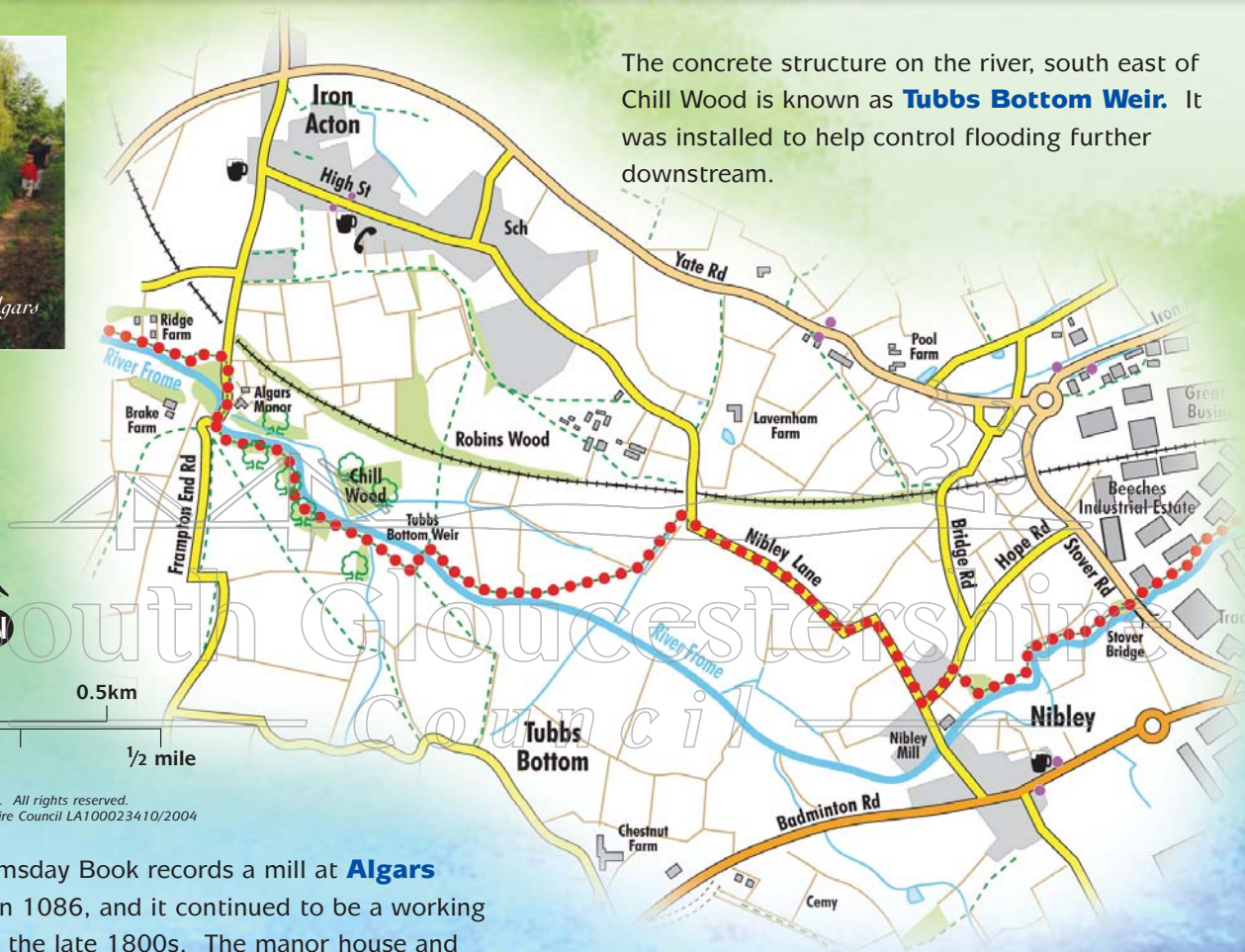


Algars Manor, Chill Wood and Stover Bridge

The Domesday Book records a mill at **Algars Manor** in 1086, and it continued to be a working mill until the late 1800s. The manor house and gardens are privately owned, but you can see a well-preserved mill race, a stone-lined channel which carried water to the mill wheel, in the attractive gardens of the Manor.

Chill Wood, on the opposite side of the river from the Walkway, is a Local Nature Reserve owned and managed by Iron Acton Parish Council. It's an attractive woodland with a variety of trees including wild service tree.

Stover Bridge was built in 1889, using local stone. There are pollarded willows near the bridge, including some which have been recently cut to encourage the growth of new branches and give the trees a new lease of life. This area is good site for wildlife, with the tall rough grassland offering food and shelter for small mammals and birds.
